

## World Teachers' Day State Awards 2019

### 1. Early Career Educator Award: Curriculum and Pedagogical Leadership

This award is for an early career educator (first 5 years) who is a member of an Educators SA association and is demonstrating outstanding curriculum and/or pedagogical leadership within their association and/or site.

Essential Information from association to support this nomination:

Indicate any special qualities/skills; additional involvements such as role within association; cross-sector work; curriculum development; leadership of programs, initiatives or events. The Australian Professional Standards for Teachers should also be consulted in making a nomination, in particular Professional Practice Standard 3 at the Proficient Teacher level.

### 2. Educators Supporting Educators Award (formerly Teachers Supporting Teachers Award)

This award is for an educator who has been very effective in supporting other educators through their association.

Essential Information from association to support this nomination:

Indicate the ways in which the nominee has supported other educators through their association and any special qualities/skills; additional involvements such as role within association; cross-sector work; curriculum development; length of service with the association.

The Australian Professional Standards for Teachers should also be consulted in making a nomination, in particular Professional Practice at the Lead Teacher level, in particular:

- Work with colleagues to review, modify and expand their repertoire of teaching strategies to enable students to use knowledge, skills, problem solving and critical and creative thinking [3.3];
- Implement professional dialogue within the school or professional learning network(s) that is informed by feedback, analysis of current research and practice to improve the educational outcomes of students [6.3];
- Advocate, participate in and lead strategies to support high-quality professional learning opportunities for colleagues that focus on improved student learning [6.4].

### 3. Leading Education Forward (new award)

This award is for an individual or association that is actively exploring and progressing teaching and learning for the 2030's.

In submitting for the Award, individual and association applicants should reference the OECD Learning Compass 2030 <https://www.oecd.org/education/2030-project/teaching-and-learning/learning/> with a focus on key areas of innovation such as:

- Student Agency (in learning)
- Transformative Competencies
- Creating New Value
- Knowledge for 2030
- The AAR Cycle

Association applicants should outline how they are incorporating one or more of the above areas in their professional learning or other association activities. Individual applicants should outline how they use one or more of the above to guide their own practice or influence the practice of others.

#### **4. Innovative Association Award**

This award recognises and encourages education associations which develop innovative and creative professional learning structures and opportunities.

#### **5. Connecting with Regional Educators Award** (instituted in 2018 as the Connecting our Education Community Award)

This award is for an association that is making progress in ensuring all members, no matter their geographical location or circumstance, can participate in association events, activities and governance. Applicants should provide information on how they are engaging members or prospective member in country, rural or isolated areas, what's worked to date and their future plans.

#### **6. Teachers Registration Board: Induction and Mentoring Early Career Educators Award**

The Teachers Registration Board (SA) (TRB) are seeking to award a teacher/educator who has made a significant contribution to the induction, mentoring and professional development of early career teachers.

The award brings attention to an individual who has made a significant difference to early career teachers. Integral to the award is that this individual has used, or developed, or implemented professional development that is recognized as being especially important to the development of early career teachers.

## **7. World Education Forum (WEF) Award**

This award is for an educator or group of educators whose work as educators and association members reflects the Aims of the World Education Forum.

The WEF (SA) Educators Award is presented annually to a person/s who has/have displayed through their actions and work outstanding contributions in their fields. This award (currently a monetary amount of \$2000) recognises and encourages exemplary educational practice across all learning sites e.g.

- from birth to Year 12 sites and learning environments (i.e. schools, preschools and childcare centres)
- education and training of preservice and practicing teachers and childcare workers

The successful awardee/s must have demonstrated through their work proficiencies and achievements in at least two of the aims and values of the WEF.
